



A domaine which has taken a quantum leap in recent years, since being taken over in 2005 by the young Damien Livera. Renovating of the vineyards and upgrading of the winery were two of the major tasks undertaken, whilst an intelligent approach to the estate management has enabled the domaine to modernize, yet still reap the benefits in quality from the largely old vines planted in the 1950's and early 60's

Domaine Philippe Livera Gevrey-Chambertin Cote de Nuits, France

Damien LIVERA took over the family domaine in 2005. Originally established by his great-grandfather in 1930, the estate had until recently sold its production in bulk to the big Beaune negociant houses. Damien immediately set about upgrading and renovating the vineyards and winery, with a new winery operational from 2009. Whilst Damien's father, Philippe, began domaine-bottling several years ago, this trend has continued under Damien with two-thirds of the production now being bottled under the domaine name. Quality has taken a quantum leap here and there are some stunning wines being made. Grapes receive a very light pressing, and there is relatively low lees contact. Racking is carried out following the lunar calendar.

Gevrey Chambertin 'Clos Village'



Portfolio of wines:

Bourgogne AOC

From a single plot planted in the early 1960s from vineyards just below Gevrey.

Cote de Nuits Villages

Vine planted in the late 1950s in Brochon, immediately to the north of Gevrey

Gevrey Chambertin 'Clos Village'

1.5ha planted in the early 1960's, situated in the upper part of Gevrey-Chambertin immediately opposite the domain

Chapelle Chambertin Grand Cru

0.3ha giving 3 to 4 barrels planted in the early 1950s. The vines lie immediately below the Clos de Beze.
